This web site supports the Modular PGCE which is aimed at people who have already gained experience of teaching in schools or FE colleges, or have been trained overseas and who wish to gain a full academic award on a programme which recognises their prior experience and gives qualified teacher status (QTS).

The site features learning resources organised into modules and units along subject pathways. For example, on the Secondary English pathway area of the web site, there are resources for 5 subject modules, each of which contain 2-7 units, and a Professional Studies module shared with other pathways.
